### **Estate, Family and Personal Papers Finding Aid (D-F)**

Falkirk Archives holds the records of a number of local estates, families and individuals. All have a close connection with the area. Some records have been collected as examples of typical local material, such as ration books and school certificates

In this finding aid you will find a list of the records we hold arranged by the name of the estate, family or individual. Each list has a brief introduction to the estate, family or individual, giving some information on their history and their connection with the Falkirk area.

You can also search the collections through the website Collections Browser.

There are leaflets available which give an introduction to the sources in the Archives for the study of local industrial history, local social history and family history. There are also a number of educational topic source lists which can be consulted by researchers.

## Dewar family papers

Evelyn Margaret Dewar (1913-1991) was a talented violinist from Larbert, Falkirk. She attended St Margaret's School, Polmont. She started studying the violin when she was 5, and by the age of 13 she was studying with Scotland's foremost teacher of violin, Camillo Ritter, at the Scottish National Academy of Music (now the Royal Conservatoire of Scotland). She studied at the Academy until 1931. She was also a composer, and had several songs published in 1932.

In July 1932 she travelled to Pisek in Czechoslovakia, where she became the last pupil of the world famous violin teacher Professor Otakar Sevcik. Professor Sevcik died in 1934 but Evelyn remained in Czechoslovakia and continued her studies in Prague with other notable musical figures of the era. In March 1938 she gave a recital in Smetana Hall, one of the largest concert halls in Prague. The recital received very positive press reviews.

Evelyn returned to Larbert later in 1938, not long before Germany invaded the Sudetenland region of Czechoslovakia. Two concerts were planned for her in September 1938, the first in the Dobbie Hall in Larbert, and the second in the Albert Hall in Stirling. The Dobbie Hall concert was not a success, but the reason for this is not known. The Albert Hall concert was cancelled, and this seems to have been the end of her performing career. Very little is known about Evelyn's subsequent life, but she continued to live in her family home until her death, surviving on a very small income.

Evelyn's mother was also musical and the Dewar family performed locally. The family business was a Ladies' and Children's Outfitter, Wilson's Buildings, Stenhousemuir, Falkirk.

**Tommy Douglas collection**

Tommy Douglas was born in Camelon and emigrated to Canada as a child. He was Minister at Calvary Baptist Church, Weyburn, Saskatchewan, 1930-1935; MP for Weyburn, 1935-1942; leader of CCF Saskatchewan and Premier of Saskatchewan, 1942-1961; federal leader of New Democratic Party (successor to CCF), 1961-1971. He was the leading advocate for medicare in Canada and developed significant social care improvements.

The estate of Dunmore was acquired by John Murray, (later 4th Earl of Dunmore) in 1754 as a purchase from the Elphinstones. He had a garden pavilion erected in 1761 which supported the Dunmore Pineapple, a folly in the shape of a pineapple. The village of Elphinstone Pans was renamed Dunmore and was rebuilt as a model village in the mid-19th century by one of John Murray's descendants. The Murray family sold the estates in 1911.

## Margaret Ferguson papers

Margaret Ferguson was born in Denny on 3<sup>rd</sup> February 1937, the youngest of seven children. She lived there all her life and never married. Margaret began her career as a librarian at the Mitchell library in Glasgow. She went on to work at Falkirk library as well as the Callendar Park College of Education library. Margaret was a prominent supporter of the campaign to save the college. After retiring, Margaret volunteered with a hospice in Denny.

The material in this collection relates to the campaign to prevent Callendar Park College of Education from closing. The college opened in 1964 as a response to teacher shortages in Scotland during the 1960s. Despite the campaign to save the college, the Scottish Government's review, 'Teacher Training from 1977 Onwards', eventually led to its closure in 1981.

## James Fitz Morris Papers

James Fitz Morris was a First World War pilot. He was a former pupil of Laurieston School. He passed Civil Service entrance exams on leaving school but deferred his entry preferring to join to enlist in the army early in the First World War. He initially served as a Motor Despatch Rider with the Highland Light Infantry but was promoted into the Royal Flying Corps after only 3 months where he trained as a pilot. In June 1915 he was mentioned in despatches.

After recovering from a serious accident in August 1916 he returned to duty as an instructor at Harlaxton aerodrome near Grantham in Lincolnshire. During this time he was promoted to Captain. He was back in France by July 1917 and soon began to rack up victories against enemy planes – by the end of August he had amassed 5 victories which qualified him as an ‘ace’ In Sep 1917 he was awarded the Military Cross. In Jan 1918 he was awarded a Belgian Croix de Guerre and a Bar to his Military Cross. He was also recommended for a DSO.

In spring 1918 he was back in Britain. By this time he had been officially credited with 14 victories. His unofficial tally seems to have been between 29 and 31. While at home on leave he was presented with a Sword of Honour and a gold watch by the inhabitants of Polmont.

It was then decided he should be sent to the USA as part of the British Aviation Mission under the command of Brigadier General Charles F Lee. They, along with some American pilots, were to take part in touring air displays of the USA in order to drum up support for the war and the air services in particular. During the exhibition at Cincinnati, Ohio he was killed in an air crash shortly after take off from Western Hills Golf Course, Cincinnati. Although, the cause of the crash was initially attributed to him fainting at the controls, it appears that the real cause was the mechanical failure of his Sopwith Camel aeroplane.

The tour had attracted huge public interest and the people of Cincinnati reacted to Fitz Morris's death with great sympathy. Due to the dangers caused by German submarines it was decided not to send his body back home until the end of the war. In the meantime his body was laid to rest with full military honours at the family tomb of the Groesbecks, a prominent Cincinnati family. His funeral cortege was followed by 4,000 mourners with approximately 250,000 lining the route of the funeral procession.

A year later his body was repatriated and he was buried at Polmont Old Churchyard, again with full military honours.

**W F Forbes of Lochcote**

W F Forbes of Lochcote was the owner of Maddiston Quarry. William Forbes Forbes (sic) of Lochcote appears to have died in 1877. Glen & Henderson were appointed Factors for his estate by 1877 and then as Judicial Factors for the Trustees. The estate passed to his heir and there was a dispute over arrangements for Bo'ness water supply in the 1890s.
